- The talk covers the background to Rotary (it was founded in 1905) and goes on to describe what it does and how it has grown to become the world's largest service organisation with some 1.2 million members in more than 200 countries.
- The length of the talk? Our panel of experienced speakers are adept at adapting to the requirements of their hosts. They can be as short or as not-so-short as you like but 20-30 minutes might be the norm.
- What might a speaker need? Subject to a conversation but most will use visual aids provided by a PowerPoint computer programme. Some have access to a laptop computer and a projector. You will need to provide at least a screen, projector stand and perhaps an extension lead.
- Geographical coverage? The Rotary District 1050 providing the service covers Manchester, most of Cheshire and parts of Derbyshire and Staffordshire.
